**RE: Let Lubbock Vote Political Action Committee Exceeds Goal**

LUBBOCK, TX— The Let Lubbock Vote specific purpose Political Action Committee announced today, October 17, that they have met their goal to allow Lubbock County Citizens to vote on the issue of expanded alcohol sales. The PAC, which was formed about a month ago, set out to achieve one goal and that was to Let Lubbock Vote.

The PAC was required to get 18,747 signatures of Lubbock County registered voters on a petition before the issue could be brought to a ballot. The petition drive, which kicked off on October 1, took less than two weeks to collect the 18,000 plus valid signatures, and then some.

“The Let Lubbock Vote committee is very happy we were able to meet our goal of allowing Lubbock citizens the right to vote on the issue of expanded alcohol sales,” said Chairman David George. “We’d like to thank everyone who signed the petition and showed support.”

The signatures were collected by a firm the PAC hired, Texas Petition Strategies (TPS), which has conducted more than 140 successful petition efforts in more than 70 Texas locations. TPS collected more than 25,000 valid signatures, in just nine days, on the two petitions which read “the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only” and “the legal sale of mixed beverages in restaurants by food and beverage certificate holders only.”

“The Lubbock County effort was the fastest, most effective collection effort ever conducted by TPS,” said TPS Partner John Hatch. “Lubbock County’s registered voters came out in overwhelming numbers to sign the petitions.”
